CHAPLAIN'S COMMENTS

Dear Comrades,

When I venture out on the ice to fish for the first time I cannot help but remember the story of the Four Chaplin's. How terribly cold the water must have been on that faithful day!

The year was 1943; we are at war and on Feb 2nd the luxury liner Dorchester, converted to an Army transport, was moving between New Found land and Greenland, in the icy Atlantic. She was packed with 902 men on board. The Captain ordered everyone to keep the life jackets on and sleep in their clothing because a German sub had been spotted. But because of the heat from the engines below decks and men being packed like sardines many disregarded orders.

At 12:55 a.m. a German sub fired it's torpedoes and lit the starboard side far below the water line. The Dorchester, mortally hit, begins to sink. Power was out no lights, the ship dinking, panic and chaos set in! Through the pandemonium four Army Chaplains brought hope in despair and light in darkness; they were Lt. George L. Fox, Methodist; Alexander D. Goode, Jewish; Lt. John P. Washington, Roman Catholic; and Lt. Clark V. Poling, Reformed. These four spread out and calmed the frightened, tended the wounded guided the disoriented to lifeboats. They were heard offering prayers for the dying and encouraged those who would live.

A sailor, Petty Officer Mahoney; tried to re-enter his cabin because he forgot his gloves but Rabbi Goods stopped him. "Never mind Goode said "I have two pair" and he gave Mahoney his own gloves. Later Mahoney realized the Rabbi did not conveniently have two pair of gloves and had just decided not to leave the stricken Dorchester. When all life jackets were handed out the four Chaplains removed theirs and handed them to the next four men in line. Never asking what faith they practiced! It was the first thing I have ever seen or hope to see this side of heaven." Said John Ladd, a survivor who saw the Champlain's selfless act.

Of the 902 men on board, 672 died. As the Dorchester sank men in life boats could see the Four Chaplains, arms linked, braded against the saluting deck, voices raised in offered prayers. This, my comrades, was valor!

These four men were awarded the Distingue Service Cross and the Purple Heart Medal and a Special Medal for Heroism, never given before and never to be given again, authorized by congress, awarded by the President in 1996. "Valor is a gift," Carl Sandburg said, "Those having it never know for sure they have it until the test comes." That night the Four Chaplains passed the ultimate test and became an example of extraordinary faith, courage and selflessness. We should forever hold them as shining examples in our lives. May God bless them abundantly as they wait for us in Heaven. Your Chaplain, Don Miklos
